Positive Coaching Alliance

2021-2022 WLF Events Director's Annual Report

WLF State Tournament

- Playoffs
 - The playoffs went as well as expected. Very few issues throughout the playoffs from an Events side. There were a couple of player ejections, but I don't think there were any other major issues from an officiating side.
 - Dave Wollin and Tracey Kaczik game up with a system where officials reported scores directly to Tracey. It sounded like that process worked smoothly.
 - Neutral Site Games
 - Stevens Point and Wausau were great hosts. I would recommend that we use them again. Striping fields for the girl's games was a complaint I heard.
 - There were several complaints received from Verona girls having to travel to Wausau as a host. The rule is self-explanatory.
- State Championship Day
 - Venue: Hart Park
 - The venue had everything we needed. 2 good sized locker rooms, 1 officials' room and 1 training room with ice (that also doubled as a second umpires' room for women).
 - Attendance
 - Ticket Sales
 - Livestream Viewership
 - Hosted by Wisconsin High School Lax. I would for sure invite them back. Originally supposed to be hosted by Raider Streaming out of Hudson. They cancelled in April due to being "double booked".
 - 1,700+ for the girls game and 3700+ for the boys game
 - Biggest addition to the girls coverage was having a color commentator that knew about the girls game.
 - Sponsors
 - Title - None
 - Streaming/Broadcast - None
 - Platinum – Alpha Lacrosse
 - Gold – Hot4Lax and Sconnie Athletic Co. – Both sponsors offered to provide in kind donations for the sponsorship. Hot4Lax provided balls and nets for the events. Items offered by Sconnie Athletic Co. never arrived, thus no donation was received.
 - Silver – None
 - My first thing with sponsors is that needs to be handled as soon as the date is set. It would also help to get support from the local chapters. I am not faulting the local chapters as I did not contact them with ample time. It was difficult as an outsider to contact local companies.

- Second, if companies are willing to provide in-kind donations, a deposit will be asked before any items are given.
- Apparel/Equipment Sales
 - Sconnie Athletic Co.
 - Sconnie Athletic Co. was the apparel vendor for the event. I had also asked them to sell state t-shirts. It was assumed that the profit sales from those shirts would be returned to WLF. I will take fault for that assumption and find a different apparel vendor in the future who is willing to work with WLF.
 - Hot4Lax
 - Hot4Lax was the equipment vendor for the event as a sponsor. No other relationship was asked for.
- Concessions
 - Concessions will only be held with a concession manager willing to run them. Otherwise, we will look to find a local food truck or two.
- Program Printing
 - We originally had a contract with Park Printing in Verona, WI. They put together the program and planned to print the program. They didn't have confidence we would get the program done so they cancelled the printing services. In fact, we had it done 3 days prior to their deadline.
 - Alpha Printing in Fitchburg, WI printed the programs. I would recommend them in the future for all services.
- Livestream
 - Livestream done by Wisconsin High School Lax. I would recommend them again.
- Photography
 - We had not official photographer. Tracey Kaczik did a great job as our unofficial photographer. I could investigate this for next year.
- Licensed Athletic Trainer
 - We had 3 different AT's volunteer and then backout. We ended up working with UW Health. I would recommend we work with them again next year.
- Media Coverage
 - I don't know what kind of coverage we had. I will investigate for next year.
- Hotel Block for teams?
 - We did not set up a room block for teams. This could be explored for next year.
- Hotel Block for WLF, Officials, Others
 - We did not set up a room block for WLF, officials or others. This could be explored for next year.
- Awards
 - Certificates
 - I used an example of certificates made by USA lacrosse.
 - Trophies
 - Rudig Trophies in Wauwatosa was used for team and individual trophies. They were outstanding. We also made a trophy for Wauwatosa from 2021.
- Volunteer Sign Up/Coordination

- This should be organized by the Events Director or a Volunteer Coordinator as early as March. Local clubs should be contacted for volunteers with \$25 per shift going back to the club.
- Ticket Booth
 - Ticket Booth always seemed to be staffed thank you to volunteers, Becky and Carla
- Concessions
 - Concessions were also staffed thank you to Wauwatosa Girls players
- Game Emcee
 - Kevin Lowman and Jack Roepke handled announcements for the games.
- Music
 - Music was on a tablet with setlists chosen before games.
- Raffle Ticket Sales
 - Raffle ticket sales were abysmal. To do raffle tickets again, we would need someone to coordinate raffles and raffle ticket sales.
- Game ball placement
 - This handled mainly by board members. With more volunteers, this would've been handled by a floater.
- Penalty timers
 - This was a combination of volunteers and Dave Wollin. Ideally, we would have more volunteers to help with this.
- Volunteer check-in
 - This could be handled at the ticket booth.
- Participant check-in/jersey distribution
 - I would add a volunteer or 2 for this position. Sconnie Athletic Co. and Becky helped with this
- Gopher
 - I mainly acted as the Gopher, alongside a few helpful volunteers.

***Brian Holmes, Badgerland President:** We simply have juniors, U10, and seniors, U14 (girls). This is simply because of numbers. I'm not sure on the U14 side but for U10 we only had 2 clubs that had multiple teams, Waunakee and Middleton.

We had some clubs that couldn't even field a team given only 2 levels and at U10- Deforest, Janesville, Sun Prairie, and Watertown. COVID-19 was hard on our numbers but we have improved from 2021.

I think in the coming years the WIAA sponsorship of the sport (this sounds certain, correct?) will help with numbers.

TryLax for us has been the best way to bring numbers up.

****Rich Thompson, Bay Valley President:** I agree with Brian, here is to hoping WIAA sponsorship of lacrosse will help increase numbers and add more girls' teams in the future.

One additional point: one of my goals here this next year for the BVLA is to bring together our boys and girls youth programs more often. Right now, our boys' programs are separate and more developed as compared to the girls' programs. I am hoping that if the boys' and girls' youth programs are brought together more often that the infrastructure and development of the boys' side will help foster and advance the girls side of our programs.

*****Emily Anderson, MAYLA President:** MAYLA is in rebound from the shutdown. While we experienced an 18.91% increase in boys' teams, and a 9.37% increase for girls since 2021, some programs still find it extremely challenging to field a team at any given level. Some programs again found it necessary to partner this season so that kids could play. Throughout the struggle, MAYLA added one new program in 2022. It is hoped that there will be 1 or 2 new programs for 2023. MAYLA will be re-evaluating its traditional schedule for 2023, as well as discussing the addition of 1/2 (U8) teams.

Programs have held TryLax events to encourage growth and well as increase marketing. One Program President remarked that it is a volunteer job that is 365/24/7. Programs are working hard to make a comeback.

MAYLA now provides Official's, Coach and Program Grants for members in good standing. A future reorganization of the MAYLA Board of Directors will add an Officials Director to replace the Education Director.

When Are Youth Games Played?

- Badgerland: U10 plays on Saturday, U12 and U14 play on Sunday
- Bay Valley: All games played on Sunday
- MAYLA: Games played Saturday mornings, Sunday afternoons

Challenges

- Player Registrations Post-Shutdown are increasing, but remain low
- Officials Deficit Reduction: Recruit, Train, Retain
 - There are no junior officials in Bay Valley
- Other Games Scheduled (High School and In-Season Tournaments) during the Youth Schedule: Schedule disruption and conflict, lack of officials for scheduled games (3/4 (U10) is impacted most)

MAYLA Annual Report to the Wisconsin Lacrosse Federation (WLF) 2021-2022

June 26, 2022

The Milwaukee Area Youth Lacrosse Association (MAYLA) just completed its 21st season.

MAYLA partners with USA Lacrosse, the Positive Coaching Alliance and the Missouri Institute of Positive Coaching.

The league was fortunate to see an increase in player participation and team numbers post-shutdown. Unfortunately, some programs still find it necessary to partner so that registered players have a team to play with. Partnering is different than a formal co-operative. Some teams are still very short-sided and require partnership for there to be a team. This can be said for both boys and girls.

- Boys experienced a 16.64% player increase and 18.91% team increase from 2021 to 2022.
- Girls experienced a 24.16% player increase and a 9.37% team increase from 2021 to 2022.
- MAYLA had a 19.49% player increase and 14.49% team increase from 2021 to 2022.

MAYLA League Commissioner Robin Buckley scheduled 244 boy's and 187 girl's games for the regular schedule, for a total of 481 games. MAYLA's LAXtravaganza made a comeback in 2022 and was held at UW-Parkside. A total of 78 games were scheduled, 44 boys, 34 girls. These games while played in a festival setting, are part of the league's regular schedule. Total boys' games for the season were 288, total girls 221, for a grand total of 510. MAYLA has approximately 214 total coaches.

The official's deficit is still very real so MAYLA worked to help close the gap. Twenty-eight junior girl's officials were trained a week before the season started.

In following with USA Lacrosse's Certified Coaching Requirements, MAYLA discontinued the long-standing Qualified Coaching Level starting in 2022. USA Lacrosse will be offering virtual coaching workshops for the foreseeable future so to have certified coaches teaching players the game of lacrosse became preferred.
