1. **Approval of Agenda (Kohn).** Motion to approve the agenda as drafted (Unterriker). 2nd (Kohn). Approved 7-0.
2. **Minutes from 3/19/23 (Unterriker).** Motion to accept the 3/19/23 minutes as drafted (Unterriker). 2nd (Anderson). Approved 7-0.
3. **Financial Report (Miller).** For the period 3/20/23 – 7/9/23: (1) Youth dues income of \$1325 and high school dues income of \$1990. State tournament income of \$24,857.50. Donations toward the Erin Ennis youth fund of \$1140. (2) Expenses of Additional Arbiter Licenses: \$117, Administrative (\$16.44) and state tournament expenses of \$23,198.91. (3) Cash balance on 7/9/23 was \$57,661.42. *Treasurer's List of Registered Teams for 2023: See Attachment 1.*
4. **Annual Reports**
 - a. **Officials (Wollin)** – *Officials Annual Report: See Attachment 2.* Wollin will meet with LOAs and youth leagues to explore dynamic in light of WIAA for high school. WILOA will take over officials' training for the WIAA. WLLOA is responsible for umpires' training. Working with Mukwonago to host a fall training session.
 - b. **High School Girls (Stluka)** – *Girls Annual Report: See Attachment 3.* There have been questions about where participants should play at the youth level. See youth report.
 - c. **High School Boys (Marsh)** – *Boys Annual Report: See Attachment 4.* There was a breakdown again this season in getting the boys USA Lacrosse awards submitted. Stluka and Unterriker corrected and completed the process. USA Lacrosse recommends that WLF appoint a new Boys Awards Chair for next year. B. O'Shea is responsible for ensuring that all award winners receive an awards certificate.
 - d. **Coaches (Diehl)** – *Coaches Annual Report: See Attachment 5.*
 - e. **Communications & Marketing (Kaczik)** – NO ANNUAL REPORT
 - f. **Events (O'Shea)** – NO ANNUAL REPORT
 - g. **Youth (Anderson)** – *Youth Annual Report: See Attachment 6.* (1) There have been questions about where participants should play at the youth level. MAYLA and BLA policy is that participants must play for the team serving the school district where they reside. This is similar to WAHA (Wisconsin Amateur Hockey Association) policy. If there is no team for their school district, they must play for the closest team. Participants may apply for a waiver if they want to play for a team other than the one serving their school district. BVLA does not enforce a boundary policy. (2) MAYLA is looking into having a

youth night at a Bucks game and possibly at an Admirals game. (3) MAYLA tried to have A & B levels for 14U and 12U boys this season due to the disparity in skill level amongst programs. Due to the limited number of "A-level" teams, the A teams had to play each other multiple times. The 3 youth leagues have agreed in concept to one A-level intra-league play day in 2024. Waunakee has offered to host. (4) Miller asked if there is any consideration of hosting a year-end state tournament for youth. The youth director indicated that it is a possibility in the future but there are challenges in identifying a date and host locations.

- h. **Bay Valley (Thomson)** – *BVLA Annual Report: See Attachment 7.* Thomson has spoken with the WIAA athletic conferences affiliated with the BVLA teams about conferences for next season.
- i. **Classic 8 (Fleming)** – *C8 Annual Report: See Attachment 8.* Thank you to Indy Stluka for help with e-voting for all-conference awards. The Classic 8 Lacrosse Conference will no longer exist. The former C8 lacrosse conference teams have aligned with the WIAA athletic conferences. Teams will play every other team in their conference twice and fill out the remainder of their schedule with non-conference games. (Classic 8 – Arrowhead, Catholic Memorial, Kettle Moraine, Mukwonago, Waukesha. Greater Metro – Brookfield, Divine Savior, Hamilton, Marquette, Wauwatosa. Plus 12 other teams that they are trying to work out.) Kohn and the board thanked Jack Fleming for his many years of service to the sport of lacrosse. Motion to create a voting director position (WIAA Liaison) and appoint Jack Fleming to serve a 3-year term (Unterriker). 2nd (Kohn). Approved 7-0.
- j. **Big Badger (Lutterman)** – NO ANNUAL REPORT. Big Badger conference will also realign to match WIAA athletic conferences.
- k. **Badgerland (Holmes)** – *BLA Annual Report: See Attachment 9.* Next year, the board for the BLA will be mostly new. It is time for some fresh perspective.
- l. **MAYLA (Buckley)** – *MAYLA Annual Report: See Attachment 10.*

5. Old Business

- a. **High School Transition to WIAA (Fleming)** – Fleming will reach out to the WIAA Lacrosse Director to inquire about next steps to keep the process moving forward.
- b. **WLF & High School in 2024 (Kohn)** – Janesville Boys, La Crosse Boys and Pacelli Boys did not submit the WIAA co-op application prior to the June 1 deadline. Therefore, those programs are not eligible for the WIAA state tournament series. Wayland is the only existing program that has not notified the WIAA that they will have a team. As long as a school is in good standing with the WIAA and notifies the WIAA, they will be eligible for the state tournament series (as a single school team).
- c. **WLF Youth Plan (Anderson)** – The draft youth plan was shared with the board in December 2022. Unterriker will resend for discussion in August. The main question for the board to answer is "What are we doing to grow the game?" USA Lacrosse's grant cycle is open until the end of July.

6. New Business

- a. **Elections (Kohn)** – Elections will be held in August with the new board term to begin 9/1/23. Miller and Unterriker are the Election Committee members. Three-year terms expiring on 08/31/22 are Diehl, Kaczik, Miller, Stluka. There will also be a 2-year term vacant following Unterriker's resignation effective 8/31/23.

****Brian Holmes BLA President:**

The Badgerland Lacrosse Association had an interesting season as overall registration numbers had some good and bad news. Girls' overall registration numbers held steady and unchanged at both levels (we only have "junior", U10, and "senior", U14"). On the girl's side at both levels, we saw a very small subset of teams having to co-op to form teams to participate, 1 at the junior and 1 at the senior. Boys' registration numbers fell overall with lower numbers for both U12 and U10. The bright spot on the boys' side being U8 which went up by one.

Organizationally, moving forward will be challenging as nearly if not all our board will be turning over. This is filling both occupied as well as vacant board spots. Many of our current board members have served since the COVID-19 pandemic started or earlier. Moving forward with the WIAA taking over our sport at the high school level and our organization moving to focus, only on youth forward presents an excellent opportunity for fresh volunteers to step up and contribute. I am asking new leadership to focus on bringing numbers up through try-lax clinics and getting more communication out in the schools and how to maintain interest in the sport year-round (less organized opportunities, i.e., pickup games in the fall) rather than trying to cram more into a 6-week season. Our season starts and ends with tournament style and feel that it is perfect. I don't see a movement to tournament style every weekend as a positive change. We are and always have been a recreational league and it should stay that way.

****Rich Thompson, Bay Valley President:**

The Bay Valley Lacrosse Association (BVLA) had another successful youth season. This season, the BVLA merged our youth boys and girls into one BVLA Youth Working Committee which helped foster more communication amongst our boys' and girls' youth programs which helped both sides become even stronger. The youth girls' games were scheduled at the same sites at the youth boys' games this season, which made it easier on our program leaders, officials and parents to attend youth games because they were all held in the same location and no one was forced to be in two spots at the same time. The future is looking bright for the BVLA Youth as the WIAA takes over HS lacrosse in Wisconsin!

*****Emily Anderson, MAYLA President:**

MAYLA had a busy 2023 season. While it marked 22 years as a recreational lacrosse league, we continue to work to grow this game in non-traditional area. MAYLA added an Officials Director position to the Board of Directors as well as a Little Scoopers division which is comprised of two sub-divisions: U8 and Flex6. Flex6 was requested by several programs to allow for a fun, low-cost point of entry for young players and families. We added a total of 14 new teams in the Little Scooper division. Programs continue to hold TryLax events to encourage growth and well as increase marketing. Programs have worked hard to rebound player registrations post-shutdown. While MAYLA had a record number of teams this season, team sizes are smaller for some. We had four girl's teams and two boy's teams that found it necessary to partner so kids can play. We have been actively preparing for more programs and teams to join the league following the WIAA absorption of high school lacrosse. MAYLA closed out its season with its youth lacrosse festival, LAXtravaganza.

Off-season Notes

- Sauk City was hopeful of starting the conference in the 2023 season and as a JV team. Unfortunately, participant registrations were not strong enough to field a team. They are still hopeful to begin competitive play in the 2024 season.
- Eastside (Madison) and Westside (Madison) formally combined to form a new co-op, Capital Lacrosse. This co-op combines all Madison high school public high schools, Vel Phillips Memorial, West, East, and Lafollette, as well as Edgewood and Monona Grove. Recently with the WIAA taking over administration of high school lacrosse beginning in 2024, this co-op has been approved for the 2024 and 2025 seasons. Following that it is unclear the path forward.
- Janesville returned to competitive varsity play in 2023. Not being able to field a team in 2022 because of low participation numbers. Players were given the alternative to play for Oregon. Two female players decided instead to play for the boys Janesville high school team instead.
- A request was made for two senior players as well as a sophomore player from the Janesville school district to be able to continue play with Oregon, instead of playing for Janesville. These players in question played the 2022 season for Oregon. BLA granted permission for the two senior players to play for Oregon, but that the sophomore player needed to return to playing for Janesville. This decision was reached after discussions and approval from the BLA president, BLA High School Girls VP, Oregon, and Janesville lacrosse club boards.
- The BLA experienced in their opinion a situation of an illegal rostering of a freshman player playing for the incorrect high school team based on clear and understood formally established co-ops as well as prior BLA approval. This is a concern going forward, and we hope the WIAA can do a more formal verification rostering is being followed correctly and verified.
- With low participation numbers around the league, we have concern with the low level of JV teams to help grow the game going forward. This starts at the youth level and the COVID-19 pandemic had dramatic impact on youth participation. We are hopeful with the WIAA formally

taking over administering high school level and a focused approach on growing youth numbers
this can improve steadily going forward.

MAYLA Annual Report to the Wisconsin Lacrosse Federation (WLF) 2022-2023

June 12, 2023

The Milwaukee Area Youth Lacrosse Association (MAYLA) just completed its 22nd season.

MAYLA partners with USA Lacrosse, the Positive Coaching Alliance and the Missouri Institute of Positive Coaching.

The league was fortunate to see a nice increase in player participation and team numbers following the shutdown three years ago. Unfortunately, we still have some programs still find it necessary to partner so that registered players have a team to play with. Partnering is different than a formal co-operative. Some teams are still very short-sided and require partnership for there to be a team. This can be said for both boys and girls.

- Boys experienced a 20.52% player increase and 20.45% team increase from 2022 to 2023.
- Girls experienced a 10.59% player increase and a -2.85% team increase from 2022 to 2023.
- MAYLA had a 26.78% player increase and 27.85% team increase from 2022 to 2023.

There were 224 boy's, 142 girl's and 30 Little Scooper's games for the regular schedule, for a total of 396 games. MAYLA's 2023 LAXtravaganza! was again held at UW-Parkside. A total of 168 games were scheduled, 78 boys, 64 girls, and 26 Little Scoopers on 12 fields, over two days. These games while played in a festival setting, are part of the league's regular schedule. Total boys' games for the season were 303, total girls 206, Little Scoopers had 56 for a grand total of 564. MAYLA had 152 total coaches in 2023.

The official's deficit is still very real so MAYLA worked to help close the gap by supporting YOTA and WILOA with their recruitment and training efforts for junior officials.

In following with USA Lacrosse's Certified Coaching Requirements, MAYLA has required all coaches to be Level One certified for the second year in a row. Previously, a Qualified level was recognized. USA Lacrosse will be offering virtual coaching workshops for the foreseeable future so to have certified coaches teaching players the game of lacrosse has become league preferred.

MAYLA transitioned to a new scheduling software this season, TeamSideline. It was not a smooth transition between old and new as we struggled with the many variables of a complex schedule. The 2024 season will be less chaotic as the process and procedures will be smoothed out for both programs as well as the league.
